2nd charter Admiraal Generaal, admiralty van Amsterdam, on stocks at Amsterdam 1763, launched 1764, sold 1795, dimensions 179 x 48 9/11 x 22, 70-74 guns, 550 men.

3rd charter Admiraal Tjerck Hiddes de Vries, admiralty Friesland, built (by Sjoerd Jouwerts Stapert?) 1782, captured by British 1797, dimensions 168 x 47 x 19, between decks 6'6", 60-68 guns, 1360e tons.

Admiraal Tromp, transport, admiralty Amsterdam, mentioned 1702, 34 guns, 54 men.

ship-of-the-line *Admiraal Zoutman*, on stocks at naval yard at Amsterdam october 1798, launched september 1800, 80 guns, 1829 sold, broken up 1830.

transport *Admiraliteitswapen*, admiralty Maze, hired 1702, 110 x ? x ?

gaffschuyt Adriana, fitted out als uitlegger 1798.

fireship *Afrikaan*, admiralty Noorderkwartier, mentioned 1700-1712, 30-70 men.

uitlegger *Afrikaans Galei*, admiralty Zeeland, hired 1747-148, 18-22 guns, 75 men.

8th charter *Ajax*, admiralty Amsterdam, bought 1781, lastmentioned >1783-1785<, dimensions 105 x ? x ?, 20-24 guns, 150 men.

corvette *Ajax*, department Harlingen, built by P. Schuijt jr at naval yard at Harlingen, on stocks march 1796, launched october or 18 november 1796, broken up 1824, dimensions 115 x 32 3/11 x 18, 18-20 guns, 99-140 men.

Alarm, 7th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built by John May, on stocks at naval yard at Amsterdam 14 august 1773, launched 22 july 1774, captured by British 1799?, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 125 7/11 x 34 x 13 2/11, 24 guns, 150 men.

Aletta Cornelia, uitlegger, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, dimensions 94 (prow) x 24 (outside on 'hout') x 11 1/2 14 guns, 8 swivels, 60 men.

Alida, gaffship, admiralty Maze, bought 1792, 8 guns and 6 swivels.

Alkmaar, 4th charter, admiralty Noorderkwartier, built at Enkhuizen 1782, captured by British 1799, dimensions 154 1/2 x 43 x 20, height between deck 6'5", 50-56 guns, 350-400 men, 1041e tons.

Alliantie, 6th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, launched 20 june 1788 at Amsterdam 1788, captured by British 1795, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 139 8/11 (lower deck) x 37 8/11 x 15 8/11, height between decks 5'8", 36 guns, 697e tons.

Alphen, 6th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built by May at naval yard at Amsterdam 1766, exploded in battle 1778, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 139 8/11 (lower deck) x 37 8/11 x 15 8/11, 36 guns.

Amazoon, 6th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built Bentam at naval yard at Amsterdam 1758, condemned 1772, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 138 3/4 (lower deck) x 38 x 17 2/11, 36 guns.

Amphitrite, 6th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built at Amsterdam 1770, condemned 1788-1794 or broken up 1795, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 139 8/11 x 37 8/11 x 15 8/11, 36 guns, 230 men.

Amphitrite, 5th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, launched at Amsterdam 30 october 1797, captured by British 1799, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 160 x 45 x 17½ draught 44 guns, 1183e tons.

1st charter Amsterdam, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Jan van Rheeën at naval yard at Amsterdam 1712, sold 1738, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 176 (prow) x 49½ x 17½ draught 10¼-15, 96 guns, 660 men.

3rd charter Amsterdam, admiralty Amsterdam, on stocks at Amsterdam 1763, launched 1764, sold 1795, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 167½ x 45 8/11 x 20½ draught 60-68 guns, 450 men.

ship Anna Catrina Galleij, admiralty Amsterdam, hired 1747-1748.

kaag Anna Maria, department Harlingen, hired 1799, 6 guns.

uitlegger Anna Maria Magdalena, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, 14 guns, 8 swivels, guns, 59-60 men.

transportyacht Arend, admiralty Zeeland, mentioned 1739.

7th charter Arend, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentam at naval yard at Amsterdam 1741, stricken >1779, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 120 x 32 x 12, draught 6¼ draught 20-22 guns, 150 men.

Arend, 7th charter, admiralty Maze, launched by P. van Zwijndrecht at Rotterdam 21 march 1768, 5 november 1793 ordered to be broken up, dimensions 129 x 34 4/11 x 14 3/11, 20-24 guns, 150-200 men.

yacht Arend, admiralty Zeeland, built 1789 at Flushing, lastmentioned 1817, dimensions 75½ x 20 10/11 x 8 4/11.

brig Arend, [admiralty of Noorderkwartier], built bij Mooij at Medemblik 1797, sold (To Morocco?) 1804, dimensions 75 x 20 3/11 x 15, 6 guns, 40 men.

5th charter Argo, admiralty Amsterdam, built by May, on stocks at naval yard at Amsterdam 14 december 1771, launched 9 december 1772, sold >1785-1787<, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 149 9/11 (lower deck) x 40 4/11 x 17 7/11, height between decks 6, 40-44 guns, 270-300 men; source {691} dimensions 149'8" (between decks)/153'7" (on deck)/140'2" (keel) x 40'4" (inner board) x 11'6" ('in de pompzode'), height between decks 6, height below bak 6'2", height below half deck 6'7", frigate, 40 guns, 300 men.

6th charter Argo, admiralty Amsterdam, built at Amsterdam 1789, launched 28 january 1790, captured by British 1796, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 139 8/11 x 37 8/11 x 15 8/11, height between decks 5'8", 36- 40 guns, 230 men, 704e tons.

uitlegger Arke, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, 8 guns, 4 swivels, 31-35 men.

uitlegger Arke, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, dimensions 46 x 16 x $4\frac{3}{4}$ guns, 10 men.

uitlegger Arke des Verbonds, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, dimensions 54 x $17\frac{1}{2}$ x $5\frac{1}{2}$ guns, 20 men.

4th charter Assendelft, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentam at naval yard at Amsterdam 1736, broken up 1758, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 150 (lower deck) x $41\frac{6}{11}$ x 18, 52-45 guns, 280-300 men.

pilotboat Assistentie, admiralty Maze, built by Glavimans at Rotterdam 1797, dimensions 65 x $18\frac{6}{11}$ x $8\frac{3}{11}$.

brig Atalante, department Zeeland, launched by Crul at Flushing 3 september 1796, captured by British, dimensions 115 x $32\frac{3}{4}$ x 18, 10-18 guns, 99 men.

tjalk Atlas, department Amsterdam, built at Lemmer 1797, captured by British 1799, dimensions 72 x $13\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{1}{2}$

Barbestein, uitlegger, admiralty Zeeland, bought 1746, sold 1748, 8 guns, 6 swivels, 42-63 men.

3rd charter Batavier, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentham at naval yard at Amsterdam 1746, broken up 1778, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 160 (lower deck) x 44 x 19, draught $8\frac{1}{2}$ x $1\frac{1}{2}$ 64 guns, 350-375 men.

4th charter Batavier, admiralty Amsterdam, on stocks at Amsterdam 8 september 1777, launched 18 february 1779, captured by British 1799, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) $154\frac{1}{2}$ x 43 x 20, 50-56 guns, 300 men.

7th charter Batavier, admiralty Amsterdam, hired 1784; only mentioned in one source.

5th charter Beekvliet, admiralty Noorderkwartier, built by Jan Pool at Enkhuizen 1725, deleted >1758-1768<, dimensions 132 (prow) x 38 x 16, 40-50 guns, 190-300 men: I have to add more notes!!!!

4th charter Beemsterlust, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Gerbrand Slegt at naval yard at Amsterdam 1725, sold/broken up 1741, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 143 (prow) x $40\frac{2}{11}$ x $16\frac{1}{2}$ draught $9\frac{1}{4}$ 13, 52 guns, 280 men.

7th charter Bellona, admiralty Maze, built by Paulus van Zwijndrecht at naval yard at Rotterdam 1763, sold 1785, dimensions 124 x 34 x 14, 20-24 guns, 150 men.

6th charter Bellona, admiralty Amsterdam, built by John May at naval yard at Amsterdam 1768, condemned 1796, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) $139\frac{8}{11}$ (lower deck) x $37\frac{8}{11}$ x $15\frac{8}{11}$, 36 guns, 230 men.

7th charter Bellona, admiralty Maze, 6 december 1785 ordered to be built, launched at naval yard at Rotterdam 20 march 1787, captured by British 1796, dimensions 121 3/11 x 33 3/11 x 12 9/11, 20-24 guns.

ship Den Bergh Etna, admiralty Maze, firstmentioned 1706, sold 1707.

transport Berkhout, admiralty Noorderkwartier, hired 1707.

5th charter Beschermmer, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentham at naval yard at Amsterdam 1735, broken up 1754, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 139 (lower deck) x 38 4/11 x 16 8/11, draught 7 8/11-10 10/11, 44-48 guns, 220-225 men.

4th charter Beschermmer, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentham at naval yard at Amsterdam 1741, sold to E.I.C. 1744, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 150 x 41 6/11 x 18, 52 guns.

uitlegger Beschermmer, admiralty Friesland, mentioned 1747-1748, 6-20 guns and swivels, 20-30 men.

4th charter Beschermmer, admiralty Noorderkwartier, built at Enkhuizen 1784, captured by British 1799, dimensions 154 1/2 x 43 x 20, height between decks below balken 6'5", 50-56 guns, 350-400 men, 1052e tons.

uitlegger Beschermmer, admiralty Maze, firstmentioned 1785, lastmentioned 1792, 14 guns.

8th charter Beschutter, admiralty Maze, bought 1784, sold 1788, dimensions 87 x 30 x 11, 14-20 guns, 70 men.

hooker Beurs van Dordrecht, admiralty Maze, mentioned 1702.

uitlegger Beurs van Kork, admiralty Zeeland, hired 1747-1748, 77 x ? x ?, 10 guns and 2 swivels, 46-60 men.

hookership Beurs van Rotterdam, admiralty Maze, hired 1702, dimensions 80 x ? x ?, 9 men.

uitlegger Beurs van Zierikzee, admiralty Zeeland, hired 1747-1748, 10-14 guns, 4-6 swivels, 59-60 men.

6th charter Beverwijk, admiralty Amsterdam, built John May at naval yard at Amsterdam 1767, sold 1784, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 139 8/11 (lower deck) x 37 8/11 x 15 8/11, height between decks 7'2 3/4, 36 guns, 230 men.

Bloys van Treslong, 5th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built by John May at naval yard at Amsterdam 1754, sold 1782, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 141 (lower deck) x 39 7/11 x 17 7/11, 44 guns.

4th charter Boekenrode, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Thomas Davis at naval yard at Amsterdam, on stocks 1729, launched 1732, deleted >1765-1758<, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 145 (lower deck) x 41 8/11 x 17 5/11, draught 12-13, 52 guns, 250-280 men.

transport Boender, admiralty Amsterdam, hired 1706.

3rd charter Boetzelaar, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Jan van Rheezen at naval yard at Amsterdam 1711, sold 1739, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 152 x 41 x 16½ draught 10½, 64 guns, 325-350 men.

uitlegger Bon Aventura, admiralty Amsterdam, hired 1747-1748, 12 guns, 3 swivels, 59-60 men.

7th charter Boreas, admiralty Amsterdam, built by John May at naval yard at Amsterdam 1768, lastmentioned 1786, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 123 4/11 (prow) x 33 7/11 x 12½ height between decks 6'6", 24 guns.

fluytship Bosch&hoven, admiralty Amsterdam, hired 1799-1800, 16 guns.

uitlegger Bosloper, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, 8 guns, 4 swivels, 26-34 men.

8th charter Brak, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentam at naval yard at Amsterdam 1736, broken up 1758, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 100 4/11 x 26 2/11 x 8 10/11, 10-14 guns, 99-150 men.

uitlegger Brak, admiralty Friesland, firstmentioned 1781, sold 1783, 6 guns, 20.

Brak, 8th charter, admiralty Maze, bought 1781, captured by British 1795-1796, dimensions 91 4/11 x 33 1/11 x 13 5/11, 14-22 guns, 80-100 men.

4th charter Brakel, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Jan van Rheezen at naval yard at Amsterdam 1708, broken up and sold 1736, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 142 (prow) x 38½ x 14¾ draught 8, 52 guns, 270-280 men.

4th charter [Jan van] Brakel, admiralty Maze, built by Pieter van Zwijndrecht Pauluszoon at admiralty yard at Rotterdam 1782, in British hands 1795, dimensions 160 x 45 x 20½, 54-56 guns, 1110e tons.

4th charter Brederode, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Thomas Davis at naval yard at Amsterdam 1731, broken up 1751, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 146 (lower deck) x 41 8/11 x 17 5/11, draught 12 9/11-13 8/11, 52-54 guns, 280 men.

galley Breidel, department Amsterdam, built 1799, lastmentioned 1808, 7 guns.

6th charter Brielle, admiralty Maze, built at Rotterdam 1776, wrecked 1784-1785, dimensions 145 x 37 x 15½, 36 guns, 230 men.

6th charter Brielle, admiralty Maze, on stocks at naval yard at Rotterdam 1786, launched 3 april 1787, wrecked 1791, dimensions $145\frac{1}{2} \times 40 \times 15\frac{1}{2}$ height between decks below 'balken' 5'8", 36 guns, 230 men.

Burcht van Leiden, Burcht van, 4th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentam at naval yard at Amsterdam 1740, condemned >1770-1772<, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 150 (lower deck) $\times 41 \frac{6}{11} \times 18$, 52-54 guns, 300 men.

Burgh, transport, admiralty Amsterdam, hired 1706.

Burgvliet, 5th charter, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Jan van Rheenen at naval yard at Amsterdam 1721, broken up 1740, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 134 (prow) $\times 37 \times 15\frac{1}{2}$ draught $9\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{1}{2}$ 44 guns, 220 men.

6th charter Castor, admiralty Maze, built by Paulus van Zwijndrecht at naval yard at Rotterdam 1758, captured by British 1781, dimensions $136 \times 37 \times 17$, 36 guns, 230 men.

5th charter Castor, admiralty Maze, on stocks at Rotterdam 1781, launched 1786, captured by British 1796, dimensions $142 \frac{3}{11} \times 42 \times 15\frac{3}{4}$ 40-44 guns, 230-270 men, 1065e tons.

uitlegger Cecilia en Anna, admiralty Maze, hired 1747-1748, dimensions 86 (prow) $\times 23$ (inside 'wegering') $\times 12$ (below 'balken'), 12 guns, 8 swivels, 49 men.

Centaurus, 5th charter, admiralty Maze, built at Rotterdam 1781, broken up 1792, dimensions $152 \frac{3}{11} \times 42 \times 15\frac{3}{4}$ 40 guns, 250 men.

Cerberus, 3rd charter, admiralty Amsterdam, on stocks at Amsterdam 31 august 1782, launched 22 march 1784, captured by British 1799, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) $167\frac{1}{2} \times 46 \frac{9}{11} \times 20\frac{1}{2}$ height between decks below 'balken' 6'6", 60-68 guns, 450 men.

schooner Cerberus, bought 1799, captured by British 1804, 7 guns.

uitlegger Charming Jane, admiralty Zeeland, hired 1747.

1st charter Chatham, on stocks at Rotterdam 1 may 1797, launched 24 may 1799, broken up 1823, dimensions $195 \times 51 \times 22$, draught fore 14 and aft 18, 90 guns.

boatship Christina, admiralty Maze, hired 1702, dimensions $83 \times ? \times ?$, 2 guns, 8-9 men.

transport Constitutie, built at Amsterdam 1797, bought 1799, sold 1815, 24-44 guns.

uitlegger Cornelia, admiralty Noorderkwartier, mentioned 1747, 12 guns, 60 men.

brigantine Courier, admiralty Maze, built 1787, last mentioned 1795, dimensions 66 x 19 $\frac{4}{11}$ x $9\frac{3}{4}$
6-10 guns, 25-30 men.

brig Crash, captured from British 1798, recaptured by British 1799, 6 guns.

uitlegger Cressy, admiralty Zeeland, hired 1747-1748.

uitlegger Cretia, admiralty Zeeland, mentioned 1748, 7 guns, 24 men.

4th charter Curacao, admiralty Amsterdam, built at naval yard at Amsterdam 1704, last mentioned
1729, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 145 (prow) x $37\frac{3}{4}$ x $14\frac{3}{4}$ draught 9- $13\frac{1}{2}$ 52 guns.

3rd charter Dalen /Dalem, admiralty Amsterdam, built at Amsterdam 1708, sold 1717, dimensions
(Amsterdam foot) 150 (prow) x $39\frac{3}{4}$ x $16\frac{1}{4}$ 64 guns.

4th charter Damiaten, admiralty Amsterdam, built by Gerbrand Slegt at naval yard at Amsterdam
1723, broken up 1740, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 145 x 39 $\frac{7}{11}$ x 16, draught $9\frac{1}{4}$ 15.

3rd charter Damiaten, Amsterdam, built by Charles Bentam at naval yard at Amsterdam 1741,
condemned 1770, dimensions (Amsterdam foot) 160 (lower deck) x 44 x 19, draught $8\frac{1}{2}$ 1 $1\frac{1}{2}$ 60-
64 guns, 271-376 men.
